**Abstract:** *This article will explain the differences between British and American English pronunciation in a simple and understandable way. Although these two variants belong to the same language, there are significant differences in how they sound. The article will specifically explain the different pronunciation of vowels, the omission or clearer pronunciation of certain consonants, as well as differences in stress and intonation through examples. For example, the fact that some words sound the same in the British variant and different in the American variant can be interesting and sometimes complicated for language learners. Also, the pronunciation or not of the /r/ sound in some cases is considered as one of the important differences. The article will analyze how much these differences affect communication and the question of which variant to choose for learners. In general, this study attempts to show differences in pronunciation not as a problem, but as a manifestation of the richness and diversity of the language.*

**Annotatsiya:** *Ushbu maqolada British va American English talaffuzi o‘rtasidagi farqlar sodda va tushunarli tarzda yoritiladi. Garchi bu ikki variant bir xil tilga tegishli bo‘lsa-da, ularning eshitalishida sezilarli tafovutlar bor. Maqolada ayniqsa unli tovushlarning turlicha aytilishi, ayrim undoshlarning tushirib qoldirilishi yoki aniqroq talaffuz qilinishi, shuningdek urg‘u va ohangdagi farqlar misollar orqali tushuntiriladi. Masalan, ba‘zi so‘zlar Britaniya variantida bir xil, Amerika variantida esa boshqacha eshitalishi til o‘rganuvchilar uchun qiziqarli hamda ba‘zan murakkab bo‘lishi mumkin. Shuningdek, /r/ tovushining ayrim hollarda talaffuz qilinishi yoki qilinmasligi ham muhim farqlardan biri sifatida ko‘rib chiqiladi. ## INTRODUCTION

Nowadays, English is one of the most widely used international communication tools in the world. It plays an important role not only in the fields of science, technology and business, but also in everyday communication. Therefore, the need to get acquainted with its different variants in the process of learning English is increasing. The two main variants that are most widespread and have a wide scope of influence are British English and American English. The differences between them are not limited to vocabulary or spelling, but are also clearly manifested in the pronunciation system. These differences in pronunciation often create difficulties for language learners. Because words that are written the same can be pronounced differently or, conversely, despite the similar pronunciation, there are significant differences in tone and stress. In particular, phonetic aspects such as the vowel system, the pronunciation of consonants, stress and intonation determine the main differences between the two variants. For example, in some cases, American English

pronunciation is clear and fluent, while British English is characterized by a shortened or softer tone [9].

The main purpose of this article is to compare the pronunciation systems of British and American English and to reveal their similarities and differences. It also considers how these differences are important for English language learners. It is expected that the results of the study will help language learners choose the right pronunciation model, as well as develop the ability to understand different accents. In general, a thorough study of pronunciation differences is one of the important factors in effective mastery of the English language.

### **Literature review**

The differences in the pronunciation systems of British and American English have been widely studied by many linguists, and this direction is an important component of the field of phonetics and phonology. In this regard, scientific sources devoted to describing the standard pronunciation norms of the English language are of particular importance. For example, the Received Pronunciation model developed by Daniel Jones has been used in scientific research for many years as the main model of British English pronunciation. His work has made a great contribution to the development of English phonetics and has retained its relevance to this day.

American English pronunciation has been studied more systematically through the research of John Samuel Kenyon and Thomas A. Knott. The General American model, formed on the basis of their work, represents the widespread pronunciation variant of American English. In this model, the constant pronunciation of the sound /r/ (rhotic pronunciation) is especially noted as an important feature.

In modern phonetic research, the work of scientists such as Peter Roach and John C. Wells plays an important role. They provided a systematic description of the vowels and consonants in English, and analyzed the differences between British and American English on a scientific basis. In particular, changes in the vowel system, stress and intonation issues are covered in detail in their research.

In addition, modern research is also widely studying the concept of global variants of the English language, that is, World English. According to this approach, British and American English are not considered the only “correct” model, but rather one of the different forms of the English language. In this regard, differences in pronunciation are interpreted not as a problem for language learners, but as an opportunity to adapt and develop communicative competence. The existing literature shows that the pronunciation systems of British and American English have been studied in depth and comprehensively. At the same time, modern research emphasizes the need to analyze these differences not only phonetically, but also in a social and cultural context.

### **Results**

The comparative analysis showed that there are a number of systematic and clear differences between the pronunciation of British and American English. First of all, the

differences in the vowel system are most noticeable. For example, words such as bath, dance, last are pronounced with a long /ɑ:/ in British English, while in American English they are usually pronounced with a short /æ/. Also, the vowels in words such as lot and hot are heard differently in the two versions. This indicates a specific development of the vowel system in both versions [7].

The second important result concerns the pronunciation of the /r/ sound. American English is considered rhotic, that is, the /r/ sound is pronounced clearly in all positions of the word, even at the end (car, teacher). In British English, especially in standard pronunciation, the /r/ sound is often not pronounced and is heard only if it is followed by a vowel. This difference has a significant impact on the overall tone and audibility of speech.

Significant differences were also observed in the pronunciation of consonants. For example, in American English, the /t/ sound in words such as water, better is often heard as a soft “flap”, while in British English it is preserved as a clear /t/. In addition, there are differences in the stress and intonation system, with British English generally characterized by a softer and smoother tone, while American English has a more rhythmic and stressed pronunciation. The results show that the differences between the pronunciation systems of British and American English are systematic and important enough to be worth studying, and they directly affect the listening and speaking skills of language learners.

### **Analysis**

The results obtained show that the differences between British and American English pronunciation are not accidental, but are based on historical and phonological laws [5]. First of all, the differences in the vowel system are associated with the independent development of the English language in different regions. While pronunciation norms are traditionally formed in Britain, the desire for simplification and convenience is more pronounced in American English. Therefore, many sounds are pronounced shorter and more clearly in American English. The use of the sound /r/ is also one of the important phonological differences. In American English, its constant pronunciation makes speech more fluent and clear, while in British English, the omission of /r/ leads to a softer and more elongated tone. This difference is considered not only a phonetic, but also a sign of social and cultural identification.

The pronunciation of consonants, in particular /t/, is also an important sign between the two variants [3]. In American English, the soft transition of this sound increases the speed of speech, while in British English, the clear pronunciation makes speech more formal and clear. Differences in the stress and intonation system play an important role in expressing meaning and emotional nuances in the communication process. These differences may initially cause difficulties for language learners, but they are overcome over time through adaptation. On the contrary, this diversity demonstrates the richness of the English language and allows learners to understand different accents. Thus, a thorough analysis of differences in pronunciation not only expands phonetic knowledge, but also serves to develop practical communicative skills.

### **Discussion**

The results of this study once again confirm that the differences between the pronunciation of British and American English are a natural and legitimate phenomenon in the language system [2]. These differences should be viewed not only as phonetic differences, but also as a complex process related to the historical development of the language, social environment and cultural factors. In particular, as a result of the transformation of English into a global language, these two variants have become widespread and are used in their own forms in different regions.

The differences in vowels and consonants, stress and intonation identified during the study may initially cause confusion for learners. However, it is appropriate to assess this situation not as a drawback, but as an integral part of the language learning process. Practical experience shows that after language learners have become accustomed to one variant for a certain period of time, they begin to develop the ability to understand the other variant.

It is also observed that today the media, the Internet and international communication tools are causing the wider spread of American English. At the same time, British English also retains its position in the educational system and academic environment. This poses an important question for language learners: which option should you choose? The results of the study show that the most correct approach is to choose one option as a basis, while developing the ability to understand the other [4]. In general, a deep understanding of the differences in pronunciation not only enriches theoretical knowledge, but also increases the ability to effectively participate in real-world communication. Therefore, studying these differences is one of the important steps on the way to perfect mastery of the English language.

### **Conclusion**

This study compared the phonetic differences between British and American English pronunciation and highlighted their main features. The analysis revealed that the differences between the two variants are mainly evident in aspects such as the vowel and consonant system, the use of the /r/ sound, stress, and intonation. These differences have been formed under the influence of the historical development of the language, geographical separation, and socio-cultural factors.

The study also showed that these differences in pronunciation do not seriously hinder communication, but rather reflect the richness and diversity of the English language. These differences may initially pose difficulties for language learners, but there is an opportunity to adapt to them through regular practice and listening. One of the most important aspects is that the learner must choose one variant as a basis and at the same time develop the ability to understand the other variant.

In general, studying the pronunciation systems of British and American English not only expands theoretical knowledge, but also strengthens practical speaking skills. This is an important factor for using the English language effectively and confidently.
